Device Unlocking

Please note that we cannot reuse any locked devices. Please remove BIOS passwords and any other security or remote management software (Computrace etc.). Likewise for iOS and Android smartphones and tablets, please remove any iCloud or Google etc. accounts so that we can prepare your devices for reuse.

The Turing Trust are looking for donations of the following IT equipment:

- Desktop PCs
- Laptops with their chargers
- Smartphones with their chargers
- Tablets / iPads with their chargers
- Chargers and power cables (for USB-C, iPhone, Micro-USB etc.)
- Monitors with stands
- Cables for connecting displays to computers e.g. DVI, HDMI, VGA, DisplayPort
- Keyboards & mice (wired)
- Projectors
- Headphones & speakers
- Digital cameras and webcams
- Power cables e.g. UK kettle leads, clover leads, figure-of-8 leads
- Surge protectors / extension leads
- PC parts e.g. RAM, hard drives etc.
- Laptop locks
- Network switches with 20-80 ports
- Servers and storage equipment e.g. NAS

Please note this list is not exhaustive and there are often other items we can reuse; just get in touch via itdonations@turingtrust.co.uk or call +44 (0) 131 440 2619 and let us know what you have and we'll happily try to give your equipment a second life! What we can and cannot reuse

We can use a really broad range of IT equipment in our mission to equip schools. Things like mobile devices, projectors, assorted cables and networking equipment can be just as essential as the PCs that we send over. Apple equipment is accepted too. Nearly everything you can imagine being used in an office or school will likely be helpful, we've put a detailed list above.

Please note that generally all IT equipment must be less than 10 years old in order for us to effectively reuse it. We're not able to reuse any broken or damaged equipment (including devices that do not power on or broken screens) of any kind, nor printers/multifunction devices, plotters, scanners, desk phones or faxes as it creates a significant overhead for the charity to manage and process. We also cannot accept monitors/displays without stands.

Vital information to include when sending equipment to us in Edinburgh

Please always send us an asset list before sending in equipment or asking for a collection, so we can check it is suitable and also plan accordingly to receive your donation. When you have sent your donation please make sure you send us any relevant tracking information so we can confirm safe receipt of it.

Please include a note with your name, email address and company name with every individual parcel/pallet you send to us. Likewise, if your equipment is being collected, please attach this information to your equipment as yours may be one of several collections.
